Dr. Shaunna Barnhart is the Director of the Place Studies program at Bucknell University's Center for Sustainability & the Environment. In this role, she works with faculty, students, staff, and community partners on research, teaching, and outreach in the areas of community revitalization, climate and environmental action, environmental justice and community planning, human dimensions of renewable energy systems, and place-making and sustainability. Since 2020, she has worked with DEP's Local Climate Action Plan program to mentor students supporting local government plan development and partnering with local organizations and governments for their implementation. She has a PhD in Geography from Penn State University, a Masters in Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences from the University of Illinois, and a Bachelors in International Relations from Carleton College.

Isabella Briseño is a fourth-year undergraduate student at Penn State University double majoring in Environmental Resource Management and Political Science. Bella is involved with advancing sustainability within Penn State as the Executive Director of Environmental Sustainability within the undergraduate student government and a member of the Student Sustainability Advisory Council. She has interned with the Sustainability Institute for two years as the Employee Engagement intern and Academic Programs intern. Bella has conducted undergraduate research using ArcGIS StoryMaps to showcase diverse perspectives for comprehensive ocean solutions. Outside of Penn State, Bella serves as the undergraduate representative on the Ocean Advisory Council under the Hispanic Access Foundation.

Erica Brown is a 19 year old West Philly native who is tired of fossil fuel billionaires using racism to divide and distracting working families from their constant arson. She has learned a lot about climate solutions and direct action in the last 3 years and is ready to create the uprising needed to bring back power to the people

Mike Eckenroth is a Senior Energy Advisor at Nania Energy. Larry has also overseen the renovation of the Flat Iron, a historic building in South Bethlehem, that is home to The Stone House Group's LEED Gold Certified headquarters. The iconic 110-year-old building that was state of the art is re-emerging as a modern building with a low carbon footprint. Larry also serves on the Advisory committee of the South Side Art's District that is helping catalyze the renaissance of the South Side. Through his projects at The Stone House Group, he and his team share their passion about educating students about sustainability. The Stone House Group has served over 150 educational institutions, and provided strategic planning services to Connecticut College, Lafayette College, Bates College, Lehigh University, and Villanova University, among others.

Larry graduated from Middlebury College with a Bachelor of Arts. He also studied at Carnegie Mellon University Graduate School of Industrial Administration and most recently at Harvard University's Executive Leadership Program in Sustainability.

Sima Farage is a yoga and meditation instructor at Penn State. She has an MBA and once worked in the corporate, but has since left that stressful, unfulfilling life behind for a healthier, peaceful, and more meaningful life surrounding yoga and meditation. Sima has a certification in both Ayurvedic Medicine and Yoga at the Chopra Center, is a 200 E-RYT yoga teacher, and has studied with a number of Yoga masters around the nation. She's also studied plant-based nutrition with Dr. T. Colin Campbell at Cornell University and received a certification in plant-based nutrition.

Sima is passionate to share the transformative impacts of these practices with her students and is dedicated to helping others reach their potential.

Josh Hooper has been the Executive Director of PERC since 2010. In concert with PERC's Executive Committee, Josh led the transition from a voluntary association of universities and colleges to a 501(c)(3) non-profit impacting, over the years, more than 80 of Pennsylvania's higher education campuses.
